Preserving America's Premier Trans-Mississippi Civil War Collection

Since its organization in 1950, the goal of the Wilson's Creek National Battlefield Foundation has been to preserve the hallowed ground of Wilson's Creek where more than 17,000 soldiers, both north and south, fought on a hot August day in 1861. The battle, one of the earliest of the Civil War, saw the beginning of four years of conflict that would shape who and what the United States would become.

Early efforts to preserve the battlefield by the Foundation have led to a variety of projects over the years, including furnishing the historic Ray House, building picnic pavilions, rebuilding historic structures, funding a new interpretive film, and expanding the Visitor Center with an 8,000-square-foot addition to add educational space and house the Hulston Research Library. More recently our efforts have included land purchases around the battlefield to protect its viewshed and maintain the park's historic integrity.

Our current project involves renovation of the park's Visitor Center, which will enhance the experience of the more than 200,000 visitors who come to the park each year. The proposed project will provide much needed curatorial space for the park's large collection of artifacts, double the amount of exhibit space, and upgrade the Visitor Center's heating and air conditioning systems to protect artifacts and insure a positive visitor experience.

Curatorial Space

With a collection of more than 8,500 artifacts, only about 10 percent are currently on display, leaving the remaining 90 percent in storage. The current storage facilities are inadequate, difficult to access, and in many cases do not meet critical curatorial standards. There is a pressing need for adequate and updated compact storage for the collection's artifacts, many of which are irreplaceable.

Exhibit Space

The current project will increase the amount of display space by 100 percent, allowing more artifacts to be on display. Updates will also provide for interactive displays and "virtual displays," allowing fragile artifacts and other artifacts in storage to be viewed three-dimensionally.

Mechanical Systems

Restrooms will be moved to allow better visitor flow and meet ADA requirements, and HVAC with energy efficient systems will be updated to insure proper humidity and temperature controls for protection of the artifacts and visitor comfort.




